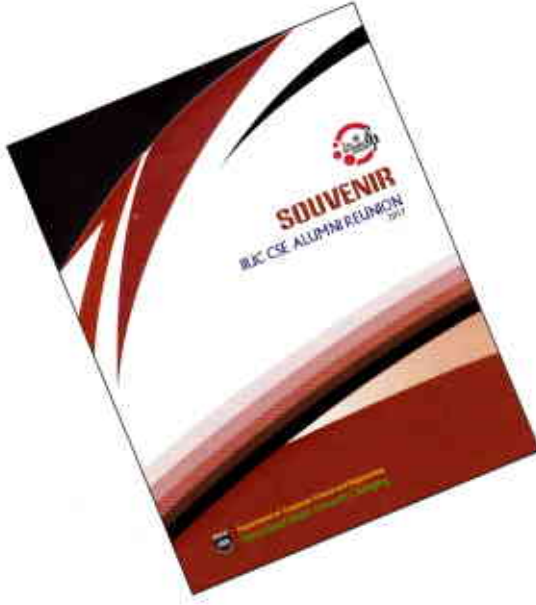

1. Future of University

1.1 Traditional Universities and the knowledge acquisition model

The traditional components of a university are:

- a. Faculty,
- b. Students, and
- c. General supporting staff.

For generations, classroom teachers have stood in front of the blackboard, using standard style textbooks, and lecturing to their students. In this environment, intellectual work is thought to be an act of knowledge transfer. The human mind is seen as a container and learning is a seen as the pouring of knowledge into it and saving it.



Studying is considered as individual work. On the whole, teachers give importance only to the process of acquiring and saving information, and doing this effectively was the goal of education. Over the years, this has developed into the traditional style of university education.

1.2 Sustainable future – Is it there?

Universities educate people who develop and manage society's institutions. Thus universities bear profound responsibilities to increase the awareness, knowledge, technologies, and tools to create an environmentally sustainable future.

Universities have all the expertise necessary to develop the intellectual and conceptual framework to achieve this goal. Universities play a strong role in the education, research, policy development, information exchange, and community outreach to help create an equitable and sustainable future.

Resource depletion, poverty, and the need for substantial assistance from developed countries have put universities in a dilemma. The global credit crunch has led to widespread austerity budgets, causing cutbacks in resources and staff at many universities - particularly of developing countries, but some are showing how to swim against the tide and expand. Currently, the higher education sector will be under increasing pressure to justify its value and so will face more regulations and greater expectations to become self-sufficient.

1.3 Global Influence - Worldwide student to double by 2025

The number of students in higher education worldwide is expected to be 262 m by 2025. Nearly all this growth will be in the developing world, with more than half in China and India. Thus the developing countries experiencing a huge demand for higher education will be unable to provide enough places (University World News - Geoff Maslen, 19 Feb 2012, Issue No: 209). So by 2025, 8 m students will have to travel to other countries to study – nearly three times more than today. Higher education consultant Bob Goddard in his book wrote -“Average annual growth in demand for international higher education between 2005 and 2025 is expected to exceed 3% in Africa, the Middle East, Asia, Central America and South America.”

Trends of enrollment and number

The number of international students enrolled in U.S. colleges and universities has grown significantly over time. This population grew from 26,000 in SY 1949-50, roughly doubling each decade to reach 286,000 in SY 1979-80, then increasing by 33% each decade between SY 1979-80 and SY 2009-10 to reach 691,000. The number of students further grew by 41% to a record high of 975,000 between SY 2009-10 and SY 2014-15. Similarly, international students’ share of total enrollment in U.S. colleges and universities increased from 1% in SY 1949-50 to 5% in SY 2014-15. 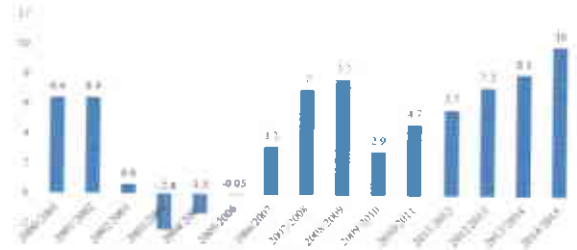

Present scenario in the USA during Trump era

Nearly 40% of U.S. colleges are seeing declines in applications from international students, and international student recruitment professionals report "a great deal of concern" from students and their families about visas and perceptions of a less welcoming climate in the U.S., according to a survey conducted in February by multiple higher education groups.

The inability of developing countries to meet the medium-term demand for education is a key factor determining number of students travelling to another country for education purposes.

Traditional source countries such as Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand and the Middle East are now developing their own capacities to offer education to outsiders.

Singapore hopes to attract 150,000 foreign students by 2015, Malaysia 100,000 by 2020 and Jordan 100,000 by the same year.

2. University of the Future

The challenge developing nations face in the 21st century is to ensure access to quality higher education for their citizens. This will not be easily achieved. Most developed nations have been building their higher education systems for many decades and, in some cases, centuries. Now to catch up and become "University of the Future" the developing nations must do more than that – but in a much shorter period of time.

The developing nations need to set about building higher education systems that can match those of developed nations, no matter how daunting the prospect. Frankly, this is a challenge that will prove too much for many nations. Higher education is extraordinarily expensive. The cost of providing buildings, libraries, support structures and staff (if they can be found) is testing the finances of even the richest nations. In many developed countries, the once publicly funded systems are now proving beyond the means of governments, and private sources of revenue have to be sought.

2.1 Rethinking University to prepare for an uncertain Future

With rapid change, the skills needed in the future are difficult to foretell. Experts throughout the world are debating and suggesting how they should design higher education to meet an unknown future skills gap.



What's on the cards for higher education in 2020?

University provides opportunities for students of all backgrounds to increase standards of living for themselves and future generations. But, to succeed, university will need to forge new business models that are dynamic, modern and fit for the decades ahead.

2.2 The Vision - Internationalizing education

Universities are no longer ranked nationally or regionally, they must compete on the international stage. It will never be easy, but it does not mean having to copy what developed nations have done. Indeed, it may be that this strategy would be wholly counterproductive. New technologies are enabling new styles of learning that are better than the traditional classroom based method (for Developed nations despite criticism). The vision is one of anytime, anywhere, on-any screen learning (World Bank).

2.3 Transforming Higher education in the 21st century

University provides programs not only to meet the demands of a rapidly changing world but also to anticipate, and indeed, preempt future advances. The University focuses on applying new worldviews based on deep understanding of ICTs. The University's guiding principle is that of "openness", a philosophy reflected in its facilities, teaching styles and content, and research portfolio.

2.4 Challenge of establishing World-class universities

A World-class 'higher education is essential for a thriving society: it is the strongest, sturdiest ladder to increased socio-economic mobility and the locus, through research universities, of most of the major discoveries of the last two centuries.'

Since 2003 the first world ranking of universities by Shanghai Jiao Tong University (SJTU), the global race for prestige and international recognition has accelerated. National universities have become a source of pride or disappointment, depending on their standing in the SJTU ranking. There is a widespread thirst for concrete guidelines on how to establish or develop universities that meet international standards for excellence.

The Times Higher Education World University Rankings (since 2004) powered by Thomson Reuters are the only global university performance tables to judge world class universities across core-missions - teaching, research, knowledge transfer and international outlook. The Top Universities rankings employ 13 carefully calibrated performance indicators to provide the most comprehensive and balanced comparisons available, which are trusted by students, academics, university leaders, industry and governments.

2.5 Global mobility

Global mobility will grow for students, academics, and university brands. This will not only intensify competition, but also create opportunities for much deeper global partnerships and broader access to student and academic talent.

2.7 Imagining the universities of tomorrow – ICT's relevance

There is no one destination or definition of the university of tomorrow — rather universities will have multiple futures and multiple identities. Such universities may benefit from a wide spectrum:

- those that are primarily teaching institutions,
- others that focus on vocational training and
- a limited number that will be consequential research universities.

6. Recently ranked #5 in an international research ranking among Bangladesh private universities- a considerable feat given that IIUC is yet to institutionalize any research program.

An unsung institution

IIUC also boasts of a beautifully architecture Mosque and a Library. And when you look at the campus from the mountains, you can appreciate the vision of what the founders had – that this institution in the idyllic hills of Chittagong would serve as an oasis of learning situated next to the vast Bay of Bengal.

Admission is not open to all with financial capacity. Unlike many private universities of Bangladesh, admission is quite competitive. In BBA and Computer Science Engineering (CSE), I was told that the acceptance rate was less than 40%. All student applicants need to sit for an admission test to get qualified for entry into a specific program.

Then there is a massive public transportation system for all students that operate with 15 buses plying the road multiple times a day. There is also a 3 bed student health center that offers 24/7 health care to students with 3 resident doctors who each do 8 hour shifts. These are university services provided to students free of cost that almost no private university in Bangladesh has a record of delivering in their business model.

Perhaps the biggest surprise comes when you try to correlate IIUC with recent events related to terrorism (Holey Artisan in June 2016) or targeted assassinations of bloggers and foreigners in Bangladesh by misguided Islamists since the last few years. Of all the religious zealot culprit students that have caught dead or alive, not a single one was from IIUC. These brainwashed and misguided youths all came from the most secular and elite English-medium private Universities of Bangladesh known for their most expensive tuition rates.

Surely – IIUC is doing something right in giving its students the right type of education grounded in real Islamic values of tolerance, mutual understanding and compromise that other private universities are failing. Otherwise, how do we explain secular universities breeding all the extremism while IIUC continues to produce mild-mannered and suave English speaking graduates who want to contribute to society through the 'brightness' of learning?

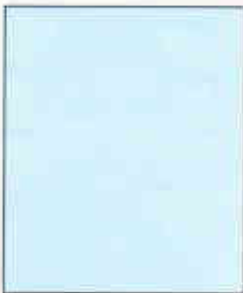

Alumni Association, Department of Computer Science and Engineering, International Islamic University Chittagong

1 DEFINITIONS

The following definitions of terms shall be adopted for the purpose of interpreting the Constitution:

- f. "Executive Committee" or "Committee" shall mean the Executive Committee of the Association, unless otherwise stated.
- g. "Member" shall mean the Member of the Association regardless of gender, nationality unless otherwise stated.
- h. "AGM" shall mean the Annual General Meeting of the Association.
- i. "EGM" shall mean the Extraordinary General Meeting of the Association.
- j. "General Meeting" or "GM" shall mean either an AGM or an EGM.

"University" or "IIUC" shall mean the International Islamic University Chittagong unless otherwise stated"

- k. "He" shall mean "He or she", and the masculine gender shall be deemed to include the feminine and the neuter genders.
- l. "Government" shall mean the Government of Bangladesh Special Administrative Region, unless otherwise stated.
- m. All plurals shall be deemed to include the singular and vice versa.
- n. Seniority shall be estimated as per the date of degree achieved from the University.

2 GENERAL PRINCIPLES

2.1 Name

1. The full English name of the Association shall be "The Computer Science and Engineering Alumni Association, IIUC", and abbreviated as CSEAA, IIUC.
2. The name in Bengali shall be "কম্পিউটার সায়েন্স এন্ড ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং অ্যাসোসিয়েশন আই আই ইউ সি"

2.2 Registered address

1. The registered address of the Association shall be "Department of Computer Science and Engineering, International Islamic University Chittagong Kumira, Sitakunda, Chittagong-4318, Bangladesh."

2.3 Official Languages

1. The official languages of the Association shall be English and Bengali. Either of the two languages may be used in any official meeting, function and document.

2.4 Objectives

1. The objectives of the Association shall be to:
 - a. cultivate a sense of belonging within the Department and the University;
 - b. uphold the motto of the University "Quality with morality";
 - c. advance and safeguard the welfare, rights and privileges of Members;
 - d. promote fraternity among Members;
 - e. represent the Members as a whole;
 - f. support and subscribe to any charitable or public body; and
 - g. assist, whenever possible, in furthering the interests of the computer science and engineering community in the society.

2.5 Session

1. The session of the Executive Committee shall commence at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting and terminate at the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

The resolution of a General Meeting shall be regarded as having the highest authority in all matters affecting the Association.

2. Each session shall last for approximately one calendar year.

3 MEMBERSHIP

3.1 Composition

1. The Association shall comprise the following types of members:

- a. Full Members; and
- b. Associate Members.

3.2 Qualifications

1. All graduates of the Department shall be eligible for Full Membership of the Association.
2. All current faculty members and students, and graduates of the University shall be eligible for Associate Membership of the Association.

3.3 Registration

1. Registration shall be open throughout the session of the Executive Committee. To be Member of the Association every alumni of the department of CSE has to go thru a registration process by filling up a registration form and paying the fees. This registration process will be conducted by CSE department of IIUC.

3.4 Renewal

1. Registered members shall renew their membership in every four (4) years. If a member pay his life subscription fee, he will be treated as life member.

3.5 Rights

1. All Full Members shall have the rights to:
 - a. participate in the functions of the Association;
 - b. vote and to speak in General Meetings;
 - c. nominate, to second and to be nominated for Election;
 - d. inspect the minutes of General Meetings;
 - e. hold office as an office bearer of the Association.
2. All Associate Members shall have the rights of Full Members except the rights to:
 - a. vote in General Meetings;

- b. nominate, to second and to be nominated for Election; and
- c. hold office as an office bearer of the Association.

3.6 Obligations

1. All Members shall have the obligations to:
 - a. abide by the Constitution;
 - b. abide by the resolutions passed in General Meetings; and
 - c. not act in any manner detrimental to the interest and welfare of the Association.

4 GENERAL MEETINGS

4.1 Resolution

1. The resolution of a General Meeting shall be regarded as having the highest authority in all matters affecting the Association. The resolution of a General Meeting can only be revoked by subsequent General Meetings.
2. No business outside the agenda shall be transacted at any General Meeting.

4.2 Authority

1. The General Meeting shall have the power to:
 - a. accept, suspend and dismiss Members;
 - b. decide the working direction;
 - c. dismiss any members in the Executive Committee;
 - d. elect any members to fill the Executive Committee;
 - e. amend the Constitution;
 - f. interpret the Constitution; and
 - g. dissolve the Association.

4.3 Chairman of the General Meeting

1. The chairman of the General Meeting shall be the President of the Executive Committee.
2. In the absence of the President, One of the Vice-presidents according to the seniority will be the chairman of the GM.

4.4 Secretary of the General Meeting

1. The General Secretary of the Executive Committee shall be the secretary of the General Meeting, to take notes and prepare the minutes of the GM.
2. In the absence of the secretary, one of the Assistant General Secretaries according to the seniority will take up the Secretary's responsibility.

4.5 Notice

1. Notice of General Meeting, together with the

agenda, shall be delivered to all Members no less than seven (7) days before the General Meeting.

4.6 Quorum

1. Eleven per cent (11%) or 101 of the Full Members, whichever is less, shall form a quorum for the General Meeting.
2. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum is present and continues to be present until the conclusion of the Meeting.

4.7 Annual General Meeting

1. The Annual General Meeting shall be held at the end of the session.
2. The business of the Annual General Meeting shall be to:
 - a. receive and adopt the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting together with the minutes of all Extraordinary General Meetings, which may have been held since the previous Annual General Meeting;
 - b. receive and adopt the Annual Report of the current session of the Executive Committee;
 - c. receive and adopt the Financial Report including an Audited Financial Statement and a Balance Sheet of the current session of the Executive Committee;
 - d. elect the office bearers of the next session; and
 - e. discuss other motion(s) delivered to the Executive Committee no less than fourteen (14) days before the Annual General Meeting and supported by no less than Eleven percent (11%) or hundred one (101) of the Full Members, whichever is the less.

4.8 Extraordinary General Meeting

1. The Executive Committee shall have the right to convene an EGM for any purpose whenever necessary.
2. An EGM shall be convened by the President of the Executive Committee within thirty (30) days after receiving a requisition. Except specified otherwise in this constitution, the requisition must be signed by Eleven per cent (11%) or hundred one

(101) of the Full Members, whichever is less.

4.9 Voting

1. Voting shall only be conducted with the quorum present.
2. Except specified otherwise in this Constitution, motions shall be adopted by a majority vote.

5 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

5.1 Formation

1. Total member of Executive Committee shall be Fifty One (51)
2. Each Executive Committee member shall be elected individually in the AGM, and shall hold office from the conclusion of the AGM in the year of their election until the conclusion of the AGM of the next election.
3. Head of the department, a male faculty member and a female faculty member, nominated by the department will be members of the Executive Committee as ex officio. No voting is required in this regard.
4. Number of Executive Committee member of the same Academic Semester cannot exceed Seven (7).

5.2 Composition

1. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the following members:
 - a. a President;
 - b. two Vice-presidents, a male and a female;
 - c. a General Secretary;
 - d. two Assistant General Secretaries, a male and a female;
 - e. a Treasurer;
 - f. two Assistant Treasurers, a male and a female and
 - g. any number of Committee members other than the above.
2. Two thirds of the Executive Committee members shall be present in the first Executive Committee meeting to decide the positions of President, Vice-presidents, and Treasurer, after the AGM of their election.
3. The positions of President, Vice-presidents, and Treasurer can be re-decided with a majority vote in an Executive Committee meeting, in which two thirds of the Executive Committee members shall be present.
4. Number of committees shall be composed within the Executive Committee members if required.

The Executive Committee shall have the right to convene an EGM for any purpose whenever necessary.

The members in the Executive Committee shall assist the President in all general affairs of the Committee.

5.3 Authorities

1. The Executive Committee shall have the power to:

- a. represent the Association in all matters;
- b. organize functions to achieve the objectives of the Association;
- c. handle the daily affairs of the Association;
- d. implement the resolutions of the General Meetings; and
- e. take appropriate actions in response to cases of emergency.

5.4 Obligations

1. The Executive Committee shall have the obligation not to receive any salary or remuneration except indemnity paid out of the funds of the Association in respect of traveling and other expenditure properly incurred from the affairs of the Association.

5.5 Responsibilities of Individual Members

1. The President, being the chief of the Executive Committee, shall:

- a. govern the Association in all affairs;
- b. preside over all meetings;
- c. co-ordinate the work of the Executive Committee and individual office bearers of the Association; and
- d. act as an advisor to the immediately succeeding Executive Committee of the Association after expiration of his term of office.

2. The Vice-presidents shall:

- a. assist the president and
- b. be acting president in absence of the president.

3. The General Secretary shall:

- a. keep agenda and minutes of all General Meetings;
- b. keep agenda and minutes of all Executive Committee meetings;
- c. keep records of all activities of the Association;

- d. present Annual Report at the Annual General Meeting;
- e. prepare and keep all general correspondences and documents of the Association;
- f. file and keep record of all Members;
- g. pass all filed records to the succeeding General Secretary;
- h. prepare and send letters to members, person related and other organizations; and
- i. help the President in communicating with publics and community.

4. The Treasurer shall:

- a. prepare the Annual Budget and Annual Financial Report and presenting them in the Annual General Meeting;
- b. keep in the Association's Accounts book a continuous record of all financial transactions and producing official receipts for all payments;
- c. provide relevant information to facilitate auditing of the Accounts; and
- d. pass all financial accounts to the succeeding Treasurer.

5. The members in the Executive Committee shall assist the President in all general affairs of the Committee.

5.6 Quorum of the Executive Committee Meeting

1. All Executive Committee meetings should be conducted with a quorum of half or more of the Executive Committee members, in which any one (1) of the President, Vice-presidents and any one (1) of General Secretary and Treasurer must be present.

5.7 Dismissal of Executive Committee Members

1. The dismissal of a member in the Executive Committee shall be considered in a General Meeting at the request of no less than Eleven per cent (11%) or one hundred one (101) of the Full Members, whichever is more.

2. Two-third majority votes are required for a motion of dismissal.

3. The responsibilities and authorities of a member in the Executive Committee shall be suspended by the conclusion of the GM in which his dismissal is adopted.

5.8 Resignation

1. Any members in the Executive Committee wishing to resign shall give writEleven notice to

the Executive Committee in no less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of effect.

5.9 Vacancy

1. The Executive Committee can appoint a Full Member, with his agreement, to fill a vacancy in the Executive Committee, with the consent of no less than fifty per cent (50%) of the Executive Committee members.
2. In case of vacancy in the position of President, Vice-presidents, or Treasurer, the vacancy shall be filled within thirty (30) days.

5.10 Notice

1. Notice of changes in membership or positions in the Executive Committee shall be delivered to all Members no less than seven (7) days after the date of effect.

6 ELECTION

6.1 Frequency

1. An election of Executive Committee members shall be held once every two sessions in an Annual General Meeting.

6.2 Nomination

1. The nomination period shall last for no less than one calendar month, closely before the AGM. The exact dates shall be delivered to all Members before the nomination period starts.
2. A candidate shall be nominated in the form of individual by five (5) Full Members.
3. The list of nominations received shall be attached to the agenda of the AGM.

6.3 Voting

1. A nominated candidate will be successfully elected if no less than half of the quorum present vote for him.

7 FINANCE

7.1 Financial Year

1. The financial period of the Association shall coincide with the Association session.

7.2 Executive Fund

1. The Executive Fund includes the outstanding balance, donation, registration fees, renewal fees and proceeds of the last financial period.
2. All Executive Fund shall be used only for activities of the Association and other purposes that comply with the Association's objectives.
3. The Executive Committee shall aim to balance the revenue and the expenditure for each function and ultimately for each Association session.

7.3 Annual Financial Report

1. At the end of each session, the Treasurer shall prepare an Annual Financial Report, together with a Financial Statement audited by a Full Member outside the Executive Committee, and a Balance Sheet, which shall be presented at the Annual General Meeting.

7.4 Expenditure

1. Any expenditure of the Association shall be approved by the Executive Committee and signed by any two (2) of the President, the Vice-presidents and the Treasurer.

7.5 Membership Fee

The Association shall collect membership fee through registration fee and renewal fee;

1. Registration fee shall be Tk. 1000 and
2. Renewal fee shall be Tk. 1000
3. Life membership fee shall be Tk. 3000

7.6 Loans

1. The Association shall not borrow any loans.

7.7 Donation and Sponsorship

1. The Association shall receive donation and sponsorship from the members as well as outside of the association.
2. Receiving donation and sponsorship shall be discussed in the Executive Committee meeting.

7.7 Bank Account

1. The Association may open a current and/or savings account(s) in any Government approved sharia compliance financial institutions under the name of the Association, provided that money can only be withdrawn with two (2) signatures from the authorized persons, which are the President, the Vice-presidents and the Treasurer.

The Executive Fund includes the outstanding balance, donation, registration fees, renewal fees and proceeds of the last financial period.

Two-third majority votes are required for a motion of amendment.

8 AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

8.1 The Procedure for Amendment

1. Any amendment to the Constitution will be effective by the conclusion of the GM in which the amendment is adopted.
2. Request for amendment to the Constitution can be made by no less than two (2) Full Members to the Executive Committee. A GM for a motion of amendment shall be convened by the President of the Executive Committee within thirty (30) days after receiving such requisition.

3. Two-third majority votes are required for a motion of amendment.

9 DISSOLUTION

9.1 Requirement for Dissolution

1. Request for dissolution of the Association shall be made by two-thirds of the Full Members. A GM for a motion of dissolution shall be convened by the President of the Executive Committee within thirty (30) days after receiving such requisition.
2. Two-third majority votes are required for a motion of dissolution.
3. Before the dissolution of the Association, all assets and liabilities legally incurred on behalf of the Association shall be fully discharged, and the remaining funds shall be disposed of in accordance with the resolution at the GM.
