Answer the following questions from the followings. Figures in the right margin are marks.

1. *The prosecution story is that M, without knowing that Z is suffering such a physical disorder that a simple blow is likely to cause his death; abets K to give strike to Z, and in consequence Z dies in spot. Witnessing father's worse situation, S, son of Z, comes out with his gun, fires at M but mistakenly the bullet causes death of V who was nearby. After trial, learned court acquitted M stating that he was unknown the disease of Z and unintentional firing and killing V. Asses the justifiability of order of acquittal of M and S by the learned court and in favor of your stands put arguments with reasoning, case references and mentioning relevant provisions of law.* [10]
2. *Mr. and Mrs. Khan already had two daughters, went to a private clinic to meet with Dr. Sharma for miscarriage for the reason that already they expected a baby boy. While operation was undergoing, some unusual difficulties occurred and his wife died due to consequence of bleeding. Considering the fact, answer the following with mentioning relevant provisions of law:*
 - i. Is Mr. X or Dr. Sharma liable for Mrs. Khan's death? [5+5]
 - ii. Is there any scope in law to justify the miscarriage?
3. (a) Under what circumstances a hurt is considered as 'grievous'?
(b) G, a girl of 14 years was forcibly picked up by a gang. What is the offence the gang liable for?
(c) When does theft turn to robbery? [4+3+3]

4. (a) What is meant by rash driving? Discuss the various punishments of it. [5+5]

(b) "*Unlawful entrance or lawful entrance but unlawful remaining into or upon the property of someone with specific motive is trespass*"- do you agree? If your answer is positive, enumerate those motives for which a simple trespass converts to criminal.

5. An FIR was lodged by F, father of a 15 years girl G, against Z alleging that he abducted his daughter and raped subsequently. On allegation, the police arrested Z, recovered the victim and produced before the magistrate of 1st class where she admitted that "*no one abducted her, rather she loved Z and voluntarily went with him and also married to him (Z)*". Assessing the story, answer the following questions under the **Prevention of Violence Against Women and Children Act, 2000 (amended in 2003 & 2020)**:

- a. Will not Z liable for rape? [4+3+3]
- b. Evaluate is the evidential value of the statement by the victim to magistrate.
- c. Is there any scope of taking legal action if F files fabricate case?
