1. a) "It should never be forgotten that the law profession is a noble profession, and it is a branch of the administration of justice." - Explain.  
b) Explain a lawyer's duties towards the Court under the Canons of Professional Conduct and Etiquette. (4+6)
2. How does a criminal case become ready for trial? - Explain in detail with relevant provisions of the Code Criminal Procedure, 1898. (10)
3. "No one can expect remedy from the court without case planning and strategy as it is an integral part of advocacy." Analyze the statement mentioning the different things considered part of case planning and strategy. (10)
4. "Cross-examination is one of greatest weapons for testing the veracity of a statement, a sword of attack and a shield of defense as an art of advocacy." Interpret the statement with the golden rules of cross-examination. (10)
5. Clarify the term 'Client Conference' with its importance. Why is a client conference necessary? What matters should be considered for conducting a client conference by a lawyer in a civil suit? (10)
6. "Argumentation is the process of forming reasons, justifying beliefs, and drawing conclusions to influence the thoughts." - Explain the statement mentioning the different purposes and golden rules of argument. (10)
7. Give a legal opinion on the following issues under the Cannons of Professional Conduct and Etiquette: (2.5×4=10)
  - a) An advocate, Mr. Anwar, advertised on the billboard and mentioned, "Those who are seeking legal remedy, please feel free to contact me without any hesitation."
  - b) Mr. Biplob, an advocate, habitually communicates with the judge in his khash room about the merits of a contested matter pending before such a judge in the absence of the opposite lawyer.
  - c) Mr. Shakil, an advocate, purchased an immovable property (plot no. RS-1102 & BS-520) in lieu of his remuneration.
  - d) Mr. Tahmid, an advocate of Judges Court Chittagong, advised his client to abscond or leave the country so that the law enforcement agency could not arrest his client.
