Bismillahir Rahmanir Rahim,

Your Excellency, The Chancellor, Mr. Vice-Chancellor, Ministers of the Republic, Graduate of the University, Teachers, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am grateful to the Executive Council (Syndicate) of International Islamic University Chittagong for the honour that has been bestowed on me by inviting me to deliver the convocation address at the First Convocation of the University. A convocation is, by its very nature, a necessary part of the academic life in a University, I am specially thankful to the Vice-Chancellor for affording me this unique opportunity to come to this seat of highest learning.

IIUC Trust fulfilled the long cherished dream of the people of Chittagong by establishing a Private University of higher learning based on Islamic vision of life in the public sector. This University has been set up in 1995. The name of any University is judged by the quality of its students, their academic attainments and reputation at home and abroad. I am confident that through the joint endeavors of the teachers and the students, in the years to come, this University will grow into a premier University of Bangladesh.

Young friends, my speech will naturally focus the contemporary socio-economic and political problems of the time in which we are living. The emergence of Bangladesh as a sovereign independent country through a historic war of National Independence has a special significance in the heart of our citizens. The language movement of 1952 culminated into a political movement, which ushered in the democratic state of Bangladesh. It was the aspirations of the people that the system of governance would be parliamentary system of democracy. Throughout the world wherever democracy is accepted as a mode of Govt., university is regarded as an integral part of national life. With the coming of democracy the importance of universities are essential as an expression of democracy itself. They are even more essential for the solution of problems which democracy has helped to create. Education is the process by which those with high intelligence and innate ability can develop their powers and train themselves for positions of leadership. The working of a democratic Constitution requires well-trained and efficiently educated leaders to run the country towards well-being and prosperity. In the context of Bangladesh, I think we have to strengthen all our institutions. Institution strengthening is, to my mind, the sheet anchor of sound governance in Bangladesh today. By institutions I mean the Parliament, the Courts, the Media, the Ombudsman, political parties-all of which are vital social institutions. Without them, there cannot really be a functioning democracy in Bangladesh. Incidentally, an institution like the ombudsman is of very real significance in a

country like Bangladesh where civil rights need to be protected from administrative corruption. Administrative corruption is all pervading in Bangladesh and as such the creation of system of the ombudsman is very urgent and important. Bangladesh Constitution has made provision for ombudsman. The Ombudsman Act 1980 has not yet been notified officially. The Fifth Five Year Plan (1997-2002) of Bangladesh has stressed upon setting up of the office of the ombudsman for making the administrative and judicial system more in the right direction.

Ladies and Gentlemen, as citizens we are all interested in building a better society for us and for our children. I will urge the politicians of Bangladesh to rise above self and take a detached and objective view of the problems of the country and try to identify practical ways and means of solving them. Nobody can solve them overnight; but something useful must be done which would be of great value to bring peace, prosperity and happiness in Bangladesh. The profession of politicians is concerned with shaping, moulding and implementing public policy. They manage the state on behalf of the people. I would call upon the political leaders of Bangladesh to work unitedly to build a viable and prosperous country for the welfare of the people by providing economic growth and employment opportunities, generating higher incomes, spreading education and literacy; improving health care and above all alleviating poverty. Unless they do so, the future of country will not be bright.

Young friends, Greek philosopher Aristotle said "the State comes into existence for the sake of life and it exists for the sake of good life". Education should prepare the future citizens completely. It is in fact the spiritual element of education, which provides the ideal of good life. In medieval society education was the privilege of a microscopic minority. It was not considered a right or entitlement of a citizen. Today that has broken down. In a modern democratic society education has been recognized as a basic right, and that is why there is a perennial conflict between numbers and quality, not only in primary and secondary schools but also in the university education as well. The overcrowding of the students in the university is to some extent is being taken care of, throughout the country, by the establishment of Private Universities at Dhaka and outside. As a matter of fact, the door of the Private University is open to every one capable of profiting by University who can afford to do so.

Of course, the function of university teaching is the advancement of knowledge, developing character, personality and leadership, equipping students for employment and above all to make a patriotic citizen. Ladies and gentlemen, I cannot define character. To me the surest and safest means of developing a strong character is to study the life of our great prophet (Peace be on him), and follow it as far as we humble men and women can do. He was the perfect man, and his life and action give us infallible guidance even in this troubled world of today. Character-building is an important function of all education. It is important to hold some ideals before the pupil. No perfection is possible in life without character. If there is corruption and want of character among elderly people, particularly in high places, it affects the character of younger generation. I also want to emphasize that the physical side

of education must not be lost sight of. We must create not only morally strong people but also physically fit persons. Sports and athletic activities are essential in both these respects. In the absence of adequate arrangements for games and sports institutions become sterile and unattractive to the student.

I am happy to note that this University is giving importance to and emphasis on scientific and technical education. Without scientific knowledge it will not be possible for us to compete with rest of the world. This University offers job-oriented courses like Computer Science and Engineering, Computer and Communication Engineering, Full-time MBA and Executive MBA. We have to modernize education. We have to ensure that the structure of education is in keeping with the priorities and requirements of the new millennium. We have to pay particular and special attention to computer facilities. There is no denying of the fact that Internet should be incorporated in the education system of Bangladesh. Today the core functioning of the outstanding technology will have a positive impact on the economy of Bangladesh. Access to good education is often limited to the rich. A quick access to the Internet system will level this playing field for all the students in Bangladesh. This will level this playing field for all the students in Bangladesh. This will affect the families of an enormously large number of lower and middle-income people, potentially propelling the country into progress. Manpower continues to be the single most significant strength of Bangladesh.

Ladies and gentlemen, this University is teaching Islamic values, jurisprudence and culture. Islam, Islamic Jurisprudence and Islamic culture can justly be regarded as a great repository of values of ideas, of ideology, which are very relevant to the national condition of Bangladesh at the present time. Islam believes in collective decision, give and take, tolerance, human dignity, social concern, neighbourliness, standard of equity and the like. All human beings are equal, you do not need a channel to communicate with God. I think that is one of the fundamental tenets of the Islamic faith. It is also one major difference between Islam and most other religions. A Muslim will talk to this Creator directly, not through any intervening agents. This is because of the closeness of human being to Allah.

I have a word for the teachers of the University. It is the teachers who are to play by far the greatest role in building up the future generation. Everything finally depends on the quality of the mind and spirit of the teachers. It is recognized in every society that the teacher is entrusted with the noble task of rearing up students, who will build the future and guide the destinies of the country. The influence that the teachers exercise on their pupils has a profound effect on our national character. A teacher in terms of morality should endeavour to be as nearly as possible a model moral person. During the days when we were students of the Dhaka University, in the early part of the fifties, we found teachers of great erudition and learning; their simple way of living and high thinking moulded our character and vision of life. Their love and affection and high sense of idealism helped us. I am constrained to say that today we find lack of respect of the students towards the teachers and a corresponding lack of love and affection of the teachers towards the students. In such an atmosphere there cannot be a healthy growth of education in the country. Because of

disturbances in the Universities, the standard of education is going down. Degrees are being obtained by adopting unfair means in public examinations and consequently these degrees are of no worth and are not recognized in foreign Universities. The whole academic environment has become restless and polluted. Pursuit on knowledge is possible in a quiet and peaceful atmosphere free from any disturbance. It is a happy sign that the private Universities have remained free from violence, terrorism in their campuses. It is for the saner elements of the society, particularly the politicians, to give anxious and meaningful thought to the issue of campus violence and terrorism in society. Let us all try sincerely and genuinely to create a congenial atmosphere in all educational institutions in Bangladesh.

I offer you my warmest congratulations on receiving degrees and diplomas from this University. This will be a memorable day in your life. Your Alma Mater furnished you with opportunities for the training of your body and mind. You are now on the threshold of life, you will be leaving the precinct of this University very soon and go to your respective fields of activities. I am sure the education you have received here has equipped you with qualities to meet every situation in life. If your education in this Alma Master has given you wisdom and knowledge, the world will be at your feet and the country will one day be proud of your contribution to its development. May Allah Bless you and may you be highly successful in life and be the source of pride and pleasure to your family, your colleagues and your country.

You have a special duty and responsibility to your nation and I fervently hope that you would consecrate your lives to the well being of Bangladesh. IIUC: The First Seven Years

The establishment of an Islamic University in Chittagong appears to be an outcome of a historic necessity. The port city of Chittagong played the role of the gateway of Islam to the whole territory of Bengal. Chittagong has always been considered the centre of attraction for the *Muslim Ummah* and it continues to be a haven of Islamic culture and traditions. Establishing an Islamic University in this region was a fond dream of a great Muslim scholar named Muniruzzaman Islamabadi during the first half of twentieth century, which could not be materialized for a variety of reasons.

In 1992 the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh passed a historic Act in Parliament - the Private Universities Act 1992. This Act for the first time in the history of Bangladesh created opportunity for establishing universities in the private sector, subject to fulfillment of the pre-requisites laid down by the Ministry of Education.

Taking the advantage of this Act, Islamic University Chittagong Trust came forward to materialize the idea of establishing an institution of higher learning, in the private sector, wherein various disciplines like Shariah, Modern Sciences, Business Studies & Medicine etc. would be offered based on Islamic approach. IUCT discussed this idea with a group of intellectuals, Islamic thinkers, social workers and educationists at home and abroad. And finally by the initiative of this body - IUCT and by the grace of Almighty Allah (SWT) Islamic University Chittagong got the approval of the Government on 11.2.1995 and the University was founded accordingly. It started functioning from August 1995 with three Faculties and three departments. These are:

- a) The Department of Quarnic Sciences & Islamic Studies under the Faculty of Shariah.
- b) The Department of Computer Science & Engineering under the Faculty of Modern Sciences, and
- c) The Department of Business Administration under the Faculty of Administrative Sciences.

Within a short span of seven years the number of departments is now six and the number of students is around two thousand five hundred. The University has been able to gain confidence and trust of the people at home and abroad, due to its quality of education, popularity of the disciplines, and ability to maintain conducive atmosphere. IUC had to open its outer campus at the capital city of Dhaka to meet the ever increasing demand of the admission seekers. The University got the official approval of the Government of Bangladesh as International Islamic University Chittagong on 10.09.2001. We have brought out more than one hundred graduates with MBA and around the same number of graduates in Quranic Sciences & Islamic Studies (QSI), Computer Science & Engineering (CSE) and Business Administration (BBA). We are specially grateful to all our donors, well-wishers and members of the Trust who have come forward with generous help and rendered financial support and encouragement for establishing its permanent campus in a beautiful location, situated at Kumira, 22 Kilometers away from city centre of Chittagong. This University is also going to celebrate the Opening Ceremony of its permanent campus together with its First Convocation marking a milestone of its rapid advancement.

The University aims at expounding the cultural background of the nation and creating awareness about the glorious heritage of *Muslim Ummah* and cultivating Islamic values about life and nature and the universe. It also makes ceaseless efforts for providing trained up manpower endowed with academic excellence, quality of honesty and professional efficiency, capability of contributing towards the socio-economic upliftment of the country and resurgence of the *Muslim Ummah*.

The University follows syllabuses of International standard, grading system of evaluation and continued Islamization process of academic curricula in different branches of knowledge and Social Sciences in particular. The University does also offer facilities to create and foster a congenial environment for the young learners who can find it a fully dependable seat of learning and a centre for career building aimed at harmonious development of body, mind and spirit.

IIUC has signed formal Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with some prestigious Universities of South East Asia and of the West like International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM), University Telekom Malaysia (UTM) formerly known as Multimedia University Malaysia (MMU), University College of Cape Breton (UCCB), Canada and Islamic Foundation, Leicester, etc.

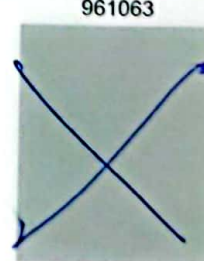
